EFNS Academy for Young Neurologists 3rd Course Hotel Bezděz, Staré Splavy, May 2 – 7 2002

With the switch from "workshops" to the EFNS "Academy" we wanted to give a more permanent label to our regularly repeated courses. A search for a more convenient venue with higher capacity to allow broader participation in the future resulted into the choice of Staré Splavy, on the shore of a romantic Mácha lake in northern Bohemia. Hotel Bezděz had an optimal technical setting and also a reserve in capacity for the future.

From the final report of the course:

Going out of this experience, the third heat in 2002 has been placed into the hotel Bezděz with bigger capacity, in Staré Splavy, North Bohemia. Its new title "The EFNS Academy for young neurologists" intends to express a more permanent character of these repeated events. This year expertise in neuropathy /radiculopathy, neuroimaging and multiple sclerosis was given by 10 renowned speakers. The reports of participants enclosed information on practical management of these nosological or methodological topics in their own countries. According to their later comments, most participants appreciated the outstanding quality of lectures and found pleasure in their own presentations and exchange of experience with other countries. As organizers we were able to observe the rapidly growing standard of presentations – from the viewpoint of language as well as in regard to dataprojection.

Also this course was accompanied by a cultural programme, namely concert on one of the evenings, and a half-day excursion to Prague.

The concert on the 2nd day was performed in a nearby castle of "Zahrádky". This 4 wing castle was built in 1560 - 1592 by the Wartenbergs and later owned by Habsburgs. Our concert included the works of Martinů, Gregor, Dutilleuxe and Purcell and was excellently performed by H. Mochanová, J.Tihelka,, K. Mňuk, R. Anderš and A. Faltusová. A half day trip to Prague was devoted to the most beautiful parts of our capital.
